Teatime Pot Holders

Somehow Alice in Wonderland comes to mind at the sight of these tea-party-perfect hot pads.

Project Specifications

Skill Level: Beginner

Pot Holder Size: 8" x 8½"

Materials

- 4 pieces blue-and-white check 8" x 8½"
- ¼ yard yellow with pink flowers for bottom cup, teapot trim and binding
- Scraps of blue-green-white plaid, pink plaid, pink floral, green leaf print, and white with pink print
- ⅛ yard fusible transfer web
- 4 pieces cotton batting 8" x 8½"
- Black and white all-purpose thread
- Basic sewing supplies and tools

Instructions

Step 1. Trace appliqué patterns on paper side of fusible transfer web. Cut out, leaving roughly ¼" margin around traced lines. Following manufacturer's instructions, fuse to selected fabrics and cut out on traced lines.

Step 2. Referring to photo for placement, arrange appliqué pieces on two blue-and-white-check background pieces. Fuse in place. Machine-appliqué around all pieces with white thread and narrow zigzag stitch.

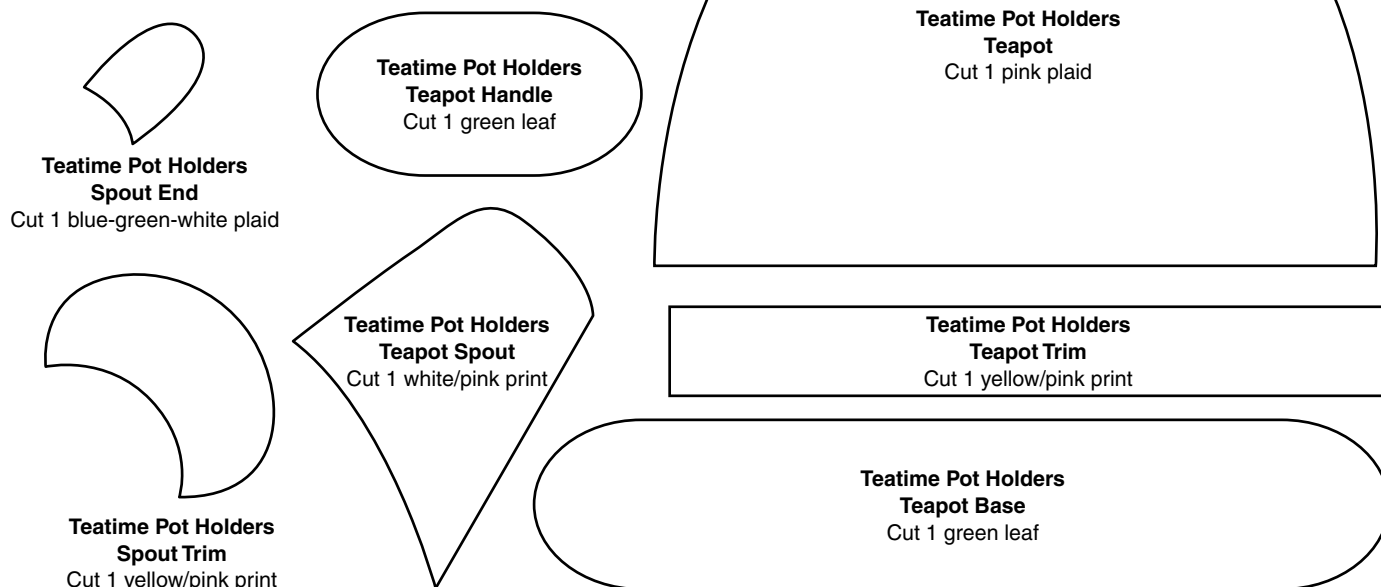
Step 3. Referring to photo, draw handle on kettle. With white thread, satin-stitch handle.

Step 4. The remaining two blue-and-white-check pieces are for backing. Layer two pieces of batting between appliquéd pieces and backing pieces for each pot holder. Pin in place.

Step 5. With white thread, machine-quilt horizontal lines at approximately ¼" intervals across each hot pad. Do not stitch across appliqué pieces, but do stitch a quilting line around the designs.

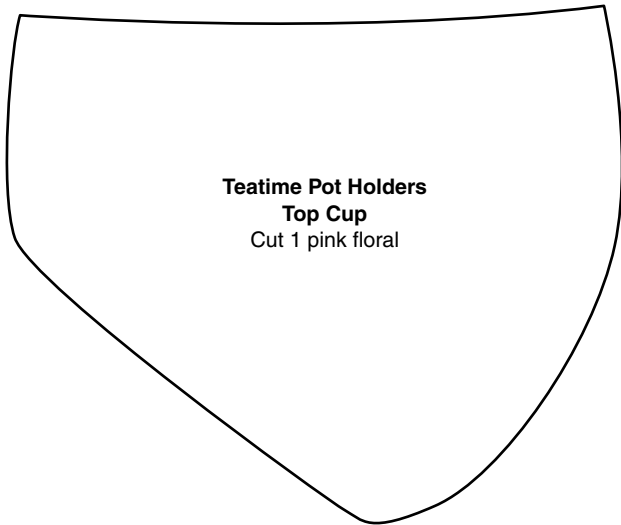
Step 6. With black thread, outline all design pieces for detailing.

Step 7. Using the yellow with pink flowers fabric, make 2¼ yards of 2½"-wide bias binding. Press in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Bind each pot holder, starting at upper left corner. When returning to starting point, create a hanging loop before finishing off. \$

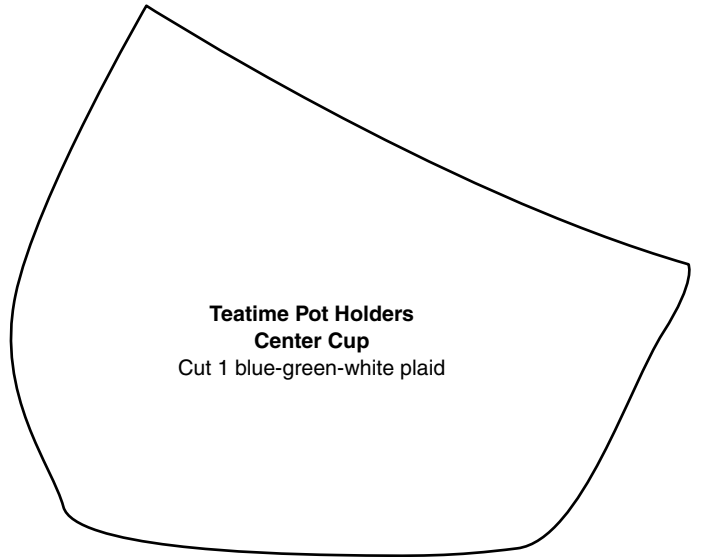




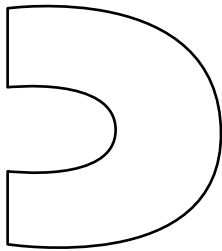
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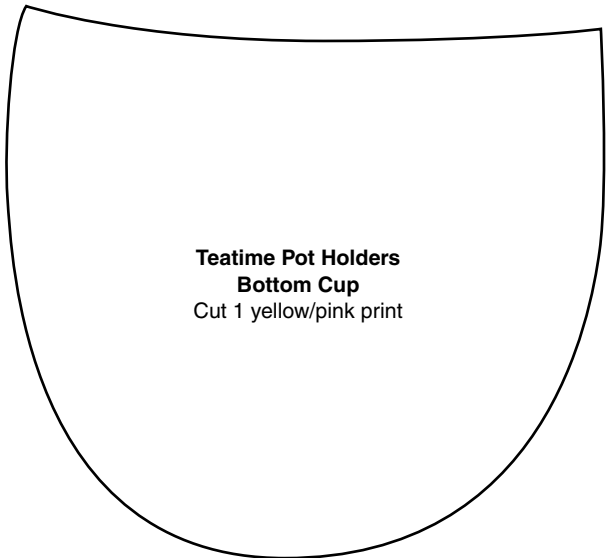
**Teatime Pot Holders

Cut 1 pink floral



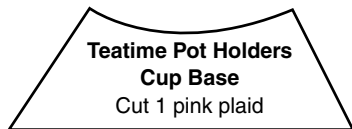
**Teatime Pot Holders

Reverse and cut 1 green leaf

Cut 1 yellow/pink print



**Teatime Pot Holders
Cup Base**
Cut 1 pink plaid

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
