Material list & cutting instructions for the Spinning Stars Quilt by size

* The following lists detail materials as they are shown in the sample image, but use any style fabrics for your own patchwork.

* Fabric requirements are based on 44/45" fabric width

CRIB size / 6 blocks / 36" x 54" finished

quilt top requirements: one fat quarter each of 10 different Loulouthi prints

cut assorted: 48 A pieces, 48 B pieces, 48 C pieces (24 right side, 24 wrong side)

backing requirements: 2 yards of any fabric you wish

bias binding: 3/4 yard (for making your own)

THROW size / 9 blocks / 54" x 54" finished

quilt top requirements: 1/2 yard each of 10 different Loulouthi prints

cut assorted: 72 A pieces, 72 B pieces, 72 C pieces (36 right side, 36 wrong side)

backing requirements: 4 yards of any fabric you wish

bias binding: 1 yard (for making your own)

TWIN-FULL size / 20 blocks / 72" x 90" finished

quilt top requirements: 1 yard each of 10 different Loulouthi prints

cut assorted: 160 A pieces, 160 B pieces, 160 C pieces (80 right side, 80 wrong side)

backing requirements: 5 1/2 yards of any fabric you wish

bias binding: 1 yard (for making your own)

QUEEN size / 30 blocks / 90" x 108" finished

quilt top requirements: 1 1/2 yard each of 10 different Loulouthi prints

cut assorted: 240 A pieces, 240 B pieces, 240 C pieces (120 right side, 120 wrong side)

backing requirements: 9 2/3 yards of any fabric you wish

bias binding: 1 1/2 yards (for making your own)

KING size / 36 blocks / 108" x 108" finished

quilt top requirements: 1 2/3 yards each of 10 different Loulouthi prints

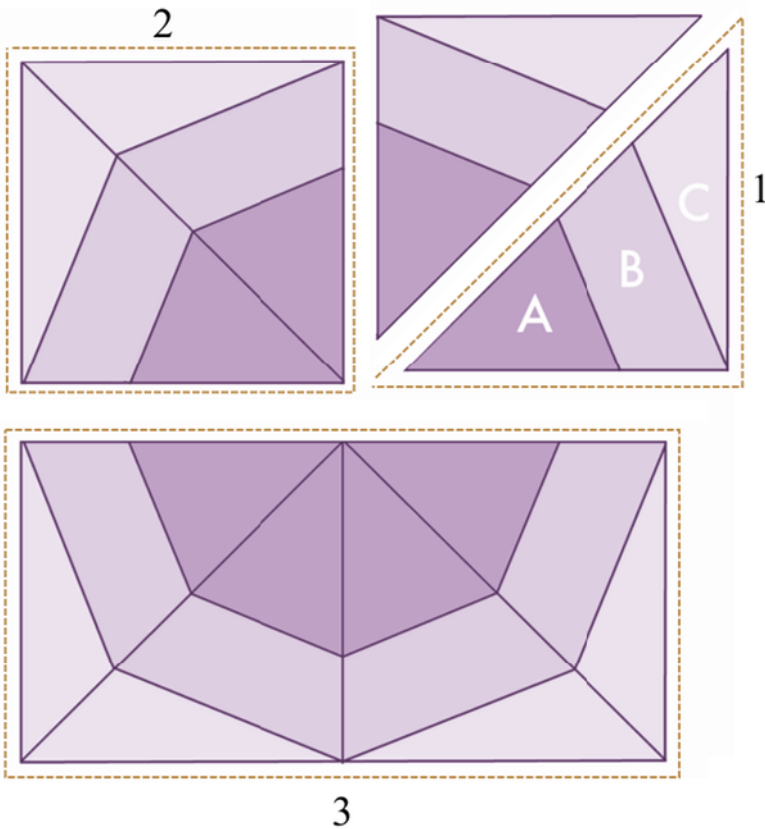
cut assorted: 288 A pieces, 288 B pieces, 288 C pieces (144 right side, 144 wrong side)

backing requirements: 9 2/3 yards of any fabric you wish

bias binding: 1 1/2 yards (for making your own)



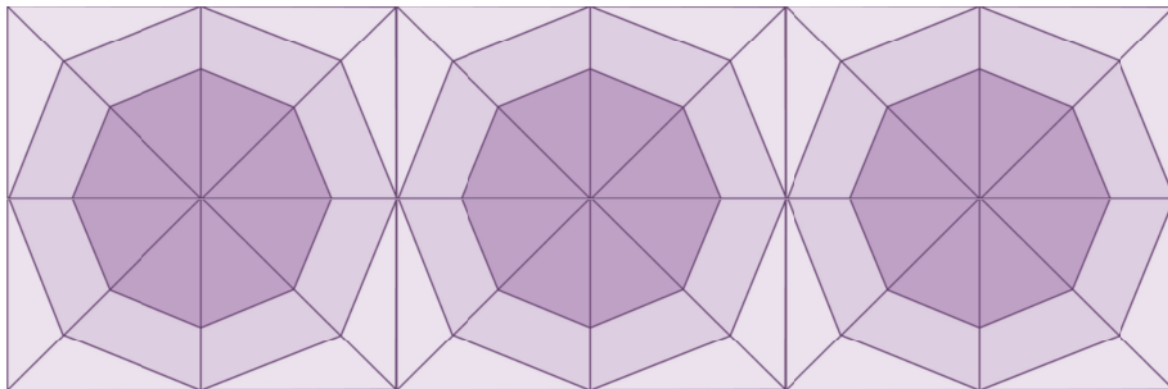
piecing order



Piecing instructions for Spinning Star block

The final 18" block is created by making 8 right triangles. Each of those right triangles is created by using one A, one B and one C piece. Use the notes on the pattern templates to be sure you are orienting the pieces correctly in relation to one another.

1. Create a right triangle by first joining piece A to piece B. Then join piece C to piece B. Repeat until you've create 8 right triangles.
2. Arrange the 8 right triangles into your desired orientation for the block. Designate four pairs of right triangles that will be next to one another in the block. Then join each pair together to create a square. Repeat until you've created four squares.
3. Join two of the squares together to create a rectangle. Repeat with the remaining two squares.
4. Finally join the two rectangles together to create the final square block.



Lay out all finished blocks, rearranging until you've arrived at your desired composition by considering a balance of color, light, and dark. Sew one block to another to create rows, the number of rows dependant on your specified quilt size. Once all rows are complete, sew one row to the next until all blocks are joined.

Create quilt backing by seaming fabric together so that the final dimension of the backing is at least 8" larger in both directions than your final quilt top. Sandwich the batting between the wrong sides of the quilt top and the backing, then use your desired quilting method to join them together. Once the layers are quilted together, you can trim the backing to be the same size as the quilt top, then bind the quilt. Enjoy!
