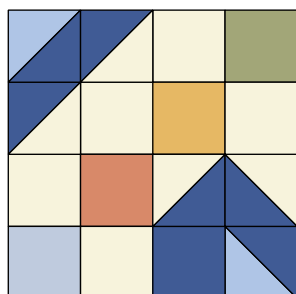

Project Specifications

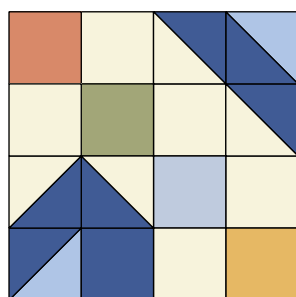
Skill Level: Beginner
 Quilt Size: 40" x 56"
 Block Size: 8" x 8"
 Number of Blocks: 24

Materials

- 1 fat quarter each peach, green, orange and blue tone-on-tones
- 1 fat quarter blue print
- 1/2 yard blue print for binding
- 1 yard cream-on-cream print
- 1 1/2 yards dark blue solid
- Batting 44" x 60"
- Backing 44" x 60"
- All-purpose thread to match fabrics
- Cream hand-quilting thread
- Basic sewing tools and supplies, rotary cutter, mat and ruler, and marking pencil

Instructions

- Step 1. Cut two strips each 2 1/2" x 40 1/2" and 2 1/2" x 48 1/2" dark blue solid along the length of the fabric; set aside for borders.
- Step 2. Cut six 2 1/2" x 22" strips from each tone-on-tone.

- Step 3. Cut eight 2 1/2" by fabric width strips cream-on-cream print. Cut each strip in half to make sixteen 2 1/2" x 21" strips. Subcut three of these strips into 2 1/2" squares for A; you will need 24 A squares.
- Step 4. Cut three strips dark blue solid 2 1/2" x 21"; subcut into 24 squares

2 1/2" x 2 1/2" for A.

- Step 5. Sew one tone-on-tone strip to one cream-on-cream print strip with right sides together along length; repeat for three of each color tone-on-tone. Press seams toward darker fabric.
- Step 6. Subcut each strip set into 2 1/2"



segments to make B units as shown in Figure 1; you will need 24 B units of each tone-on-tone fabric.

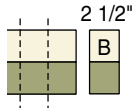

Subcut each strip set into 2 1/2" segments to make B units.

Step 7. Stitch one strip of each tone-on-tone with right sides together along length to make a strip set; press seams in one direction. Repeat for three strip sets. Subcut each strip set into 2 1/2" segments to make C units as shown in Figure 2; you will need 20 C units.

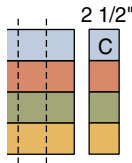

Step 8. Cut seven strips cream-on-cream print, four strips blue print and 11 strips dark blue solid 2 7/8" x 21". Subcut each strip into 2 7/8" square segments; you will need 48 squares cream-on-cream print, 24 squares blue print and 72 squares dark blue solid. Cut each square in half on one diagonal to make D triangles.

Step 9. Stitch each blue print D to a dark blue solid D to make a D unit as shown in Figure 3; repeat for all blue print D triangles. Repeat with remaining dark blue solid D triangles and cream-on-cream print D triangles, again referring to Figure 3.

Join D pieces as shown.

Step 10. Arrange the A squares and B and D units in rows referring to Figure 4 for Blocks A and B. Join units in rows; join rows to complete one block. Repeat for 12 each A and B blocks; press seams open.

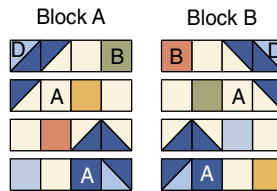

Arrange the A squares and B and D units in rows for Blocks A and B.

Step 11. Arrange blocks in six rows of four blocks each, alternating the A and B blocks as shown in Figure 5. Join blocks in rows; press seams open. Join rows to complete the quilt center; press seams open.

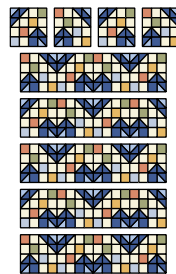

Arrange blocks in 6 rows of 4 blocks each, alternating the A and B blocks.

Step 12. Join four C units to make a border strip; repeat for two strips. Join six C units to make a side border strip; repeat for two strips.

Step 13. Sew a 2 1/2" x 48 1/2" strip dark blue solid to one six-unit side border strip; press seams away from the pieced strip. Repeat for two strips. Sew a strip to opposite sides of the

pieced center with the dark blue solid strip on the inside edge referring to Figure 6; press seams toward dark blue solid strip. Repeat on the opposite long side of the quilt center

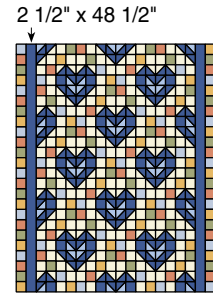

Sew a strip to opposite sides of the pieced center with the dark blue solid strip on the inside edge.

Step 14. Cut four squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" each blue print and dark blue solid. Sew a dark blue solid square and a blue print square to each end of the four-unit strips as shown in Figure 7. Sew a 2 1/2" x 40 1/2" strip dark blue solid to each pieced strip as in Step 13; press seams toward dark blue solid strips. Sew a strip to the top and bottom of the pieced center; press seams toward dark blue solid strips.

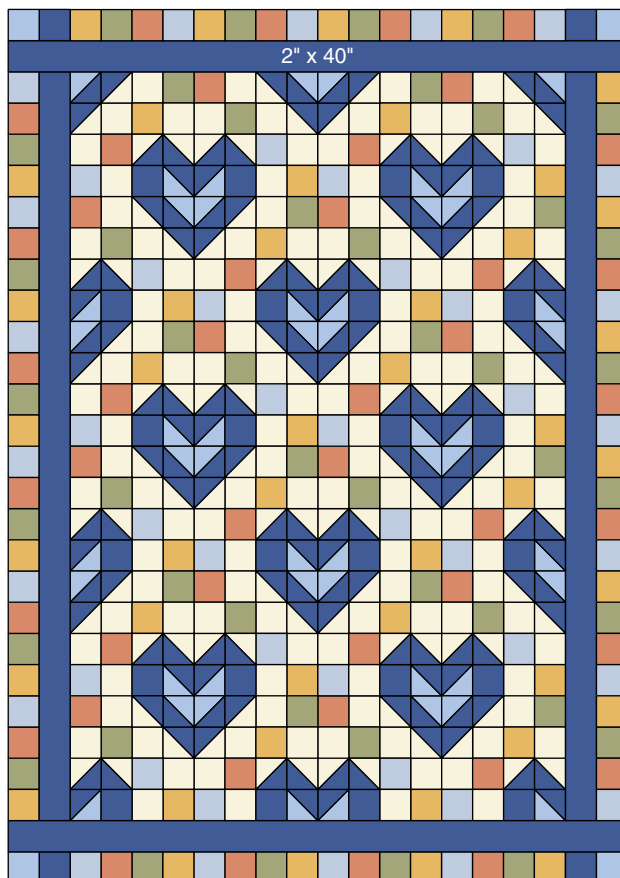

Sew a dark blue solid square and a blue print square to each end of the 4-unit strips.

Step 15. Prepare quilt for quilting and quilt as desired. Note: The sample shown was hand-quilted around the heart shapes and in a diagonal line through the center of each block and in the ditch of border seams using cream hand-quilting thread.

Step 16. Prepare 5 3/4 yards self-made blue print binding and apply.
